

WHAT CAN YOUR LIBRARY DO FOR YOUR RESIDENTS?

- Search the literature for research needs and patient care
- Assist with evidence synthesis reviews (meta-analyses and systematic review)
- Locate information resources, including books and articles
- Assist with citation management software
- Recommend appropriate journals for publications (and review potentially predatory requests)
- Curate "LibGuides" with books, journals, and other information resources specific to your program

- New paid service through CTSI

- First two hours of consultation are free, vouchers are available

NEW(ISH) RESOURCES

- Embase
 - Biomedical citation database similar to PubMed
 - GREAT search feature for quickly creating in-depth literature searches
- Covidence
 - Citation screening tool for evidence synthesis reviews (SRs, meta-analyses)
 - Create and collaborate, very intuitive
- 24/7 Library Access
 - All residents and fellows can use their Gator 1 Card to access the 2nd floor
