Major Revision of Program Requirements for Neurology and Child Neurology Subspecialties Coming Soon

The Review Committee for Neurology is preparing to begin a major revision of the Program Requirements for the subspecialties of clinical neurophysiology, epilepsy, neurodevelopmental disabilities, neuromuscular medicine, and vascular neurology and invites comments related to specific requirements or topics that should be addressed as the revisions are developed. In particular, the Review Committee invites comments related to what the respective subspecialties will look like in the future, and the competencies, resources, and personnel necessary to create physicians who will practice in the subspecialty. From Dr. Close, DIO:

Take away points from recent attendance at NRMP meeting:

(This was recently shared with all program directors)

- The number of match violation reports are much higher. NRMP is not sure why. Please do not violate the match contract.
- Here is more info about the match contract: <u>https://www.nrmp.org/intro-to-the-match/the-match-agreement/</u>
- Please review with faculty/staff/housestaff topics that should not be asked of applicants you are responsible for any question anyone from your program asks an applicant here is an example from the match documents: "Program directors also must ensure all recruitment team members are knowledgeable in the "do's" and "don'ts" of recruitment questions and activities, including but not limited to race, national origin, and sexual orientation" (Another common no-no that is violated is asking women about their plans to start a family -> DO NOT DO IT.)
- Offering more interviews than you have slots is a match violation. Several programs last year were investigated for this. Many in the audience agreed they had been investigated (but did not have findings) the common event was:
 - A program has 20 interview slots.
 - A program offered 20 interviews to 20 candidates. They asked the candidates to sign up by 48 hours in thalamus. 16 accept in 48 hours.
 - 48 hours later, the program offers another 4 people interviews, as they believe there are 4 open interview slots. Three are able to schedule, one is told by thalamus there are no positions left.
 - o The individual offered an interview but unable to schedule files a compliant with NRMP for a match violation.
 - What happened? One of the initial candidates scheduled at 72 hours (24 hours after they were told the time limit was) and thalamus let them schedule it, using the last spot.
 - MORAL please be aware you can turn OFF the offer to an applicant in thalamus to prevent this from happening. Alert candidates that they may try to schedule after the provided time but will be unable to use thalamus and must call
 - Final note- giving applicants LESS than 48 hours to schedule an interview is a match violation.
